Note: Mandeville was a Magna Carta Baron but the Post Office advise that this name is inappropriate due to Mandeville Court already being used in the same postcode area of Egham. Hardel, Mowbray, Fitzwalter, Marshall, De Quincy and Malet were all Magna Carta Barons. Langton was Archbishop of Canterbury in 1215. London, Lincoln, Salisbury and Runnymede are all Magna Carta locations. Eclipse and Victoria are old pub names and Furnivall was born in Egham and was an editor of the Oxford English Dictionary.
