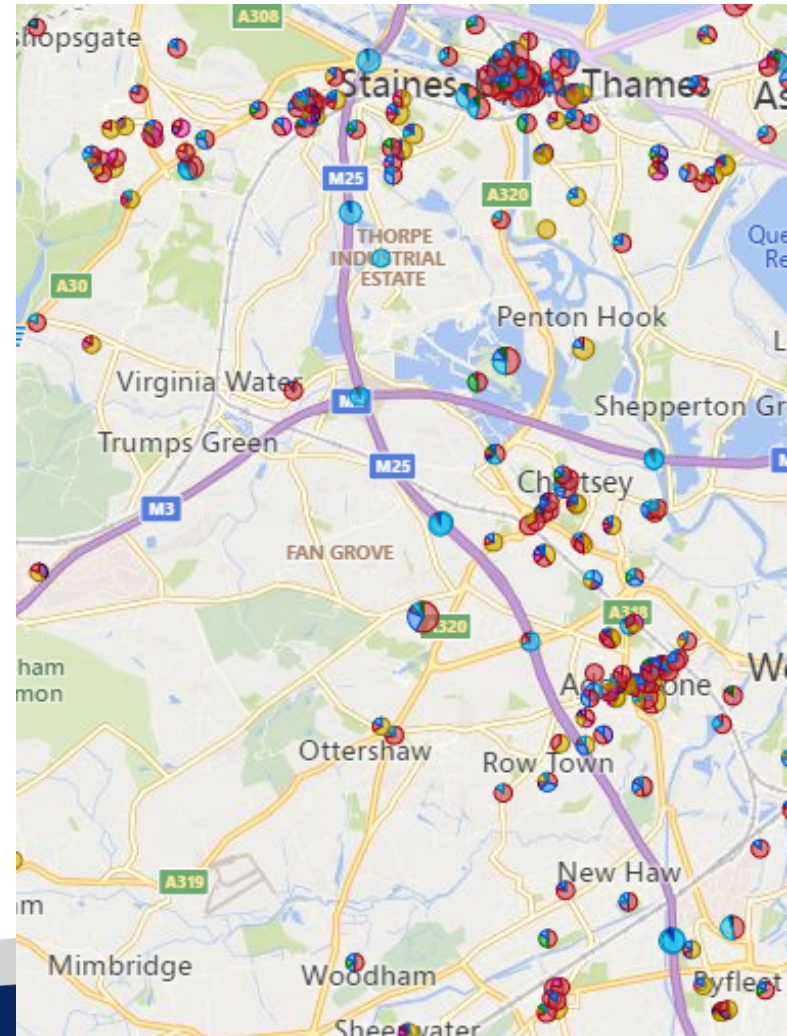

Nitrous Oxide

➤ Spelthorne PSPO since May 2021

A person who fails to comply without reasonable excuse with any requirement of a constable or Authorised Officer:

- (a) to cease consumption of a psychoactive substance (formerly known as 'legal highs') or anything which the constable or Authorised Officer reasonably believes to be a psychoactive substance; or
- (b) to surrender anything in their possession which is, or which the constable or Authorised Officer reasonably believes to be, a psychoactive substance or a container for a psychoactive substance; in any area covered by the PSPO in a public space within the Borough of Spelthorne, as specified in the Schedule to this Order.

➤ 4 FPN's and 25 warnings

➤ Most successful around town centre locations

➤ Government considering a review by the Advisory Council on the Misuse of Drugs (ACMD)

➤ One recommendation is to provide a power of confiscation
